



Robert (Bob) Ketelsen became acquainted with the Sisters in 1939 when he attended St. Patrick School in Clinton, Iowa, and had the sisters as teachers. "When I learned of the Associate Partnership Program, I knew I wanted to join. I have felt called to the community since kindergarten," he said.

Bob committed to living the gospel and Franciscan values in association with the Sisters of St. Francis on October 20, 1996.

As the owner of a travel agency outside of Chicago, Bob was instrumental in arranging pilgrimages to Assisi, Italy - birthplace of Saints Francis and Clare for the sisters. He also arranged trips to Chulucanas, Peru, where the Sisters ministered since 1965. He, himself, visited Peru.


